## CHINO ESPINOZA los dueños del son

Vocalist Mirley Espinoza, known by his fellows musicians as "Chino El Sonero", was born in the city of Alajuela, Costa Rica, on July 22, 1967.

In 1990 he joined the Opa Opa International Orchestra and recorded his first CD production for Warner Brothers in 1995.

Chino moved on and performed with many other top musical groups, including the Malibu Salsa All Stars, The L.A. Jazz All Stars, The RMM All Stars Band of the west coast and the tribute band to Tito Puente with the Eddy Palmieri Orchestra.

Chino also performed with many orchestras formed to accompany top touring artist such as: Celia Cruz, Eddy Santiago, Rey Sepulveda, Tito Puente Jr, Tito Gomez, Jesus Enriquez, Miles Pena, Many Manuel, Domingo Quinonez, Tony Vega, Hernan Oliveira, Michael Steward and Jerry Medina.
